WISCONSIN STATE COMMANDER OF THE SONS OF UNION VETERANS TO SHARE 'THE LAST SOLDIER PROJECT'

Commander Brian McManus (photo at left) will be the featured speaker at the August meeting of Tent 23. McManus who is a member of the Colonel Hans Heg Camp #15 has been instrumental in forwarding the project in Wisconsin. Camp 15 has designed a plaque which commemorates the last Union Civil War soldier each of the counties in Wisconsin. The plaque is modeled after the GAR star. (photo to left)

The "Last Soldier" project was initiated in 2003 by the Sons of the Union Veterans as a national effort to locate and appropriately mark the grave of the Last Civil War Soldier buried in each county/parrish of each state in our nation.

In the State of Wisconsin, nearly all 72 county soldiers have been identified. Key to the project is locating research, genealogical records and the grave site to substantiate if the soldier is indeed, the last Civil War veteran to die in the county.

The SUVCW held a commemorative ceremony honoring Isaiah Apollos Ryan who passed away at the age of 96 in Elkhorn. His ceremony took place at the Oak Hill Cemetery in Lake Geneva in May of 2018.

Since our mission is to "keep green the memory" of our ancestors, there is no more fitting way than to honor those who fought to save the Union. Let's welcome Brother Brian and members of his camp to our Tent meeting.
