**OUR 2018 YEAR IN REVIEW**

Where has the year gone? Looking back on the activities of Tent #23, we have had a rather amazing year. Members attended the annual Civil War Expo at the Kenosha Museum both to recruit and share ideas with those in attendance from the Allied Orders. We were thrilled by the recognition given our Civil War ancestors when the Sons of the Col. Hans C. Heg Camp #15 installed a plaque commemorating the service of the famed Iron Brigade at the Veterans wayside memorial on Hwy 12 near Sauk City. We assisted Camp #15 with a ceremony honoring Isaiah Ryan, the "Last Civil War Soldier" of Walworth County who is interred at the Oak Hill Cemetery in Lake Geneva. We also purchased two commemorative markers from the SUVCW to be placed at the graves of the last Civil War soldiers from Rock and Jefferson counties. We participated in commemorative events held by the Allied Orders at Calvary Cemetery in Milwaukee and Lakewood Cemetery in St. Francis.

We were able to enjoy educational programming at our meetings to include a portrayal of Mary Wade by Connie Hansen and "Letters from the Home Front" by Georgia Kestol whose ancestor from Walworth County fought and died in the Civil War. Wisconsin SUVCW Commander. Brian McManus, gave a presentation regarding the Last Soldier project. Ellen Holly shared her stories and trips to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota where our Tent donates to the homeless vets.
