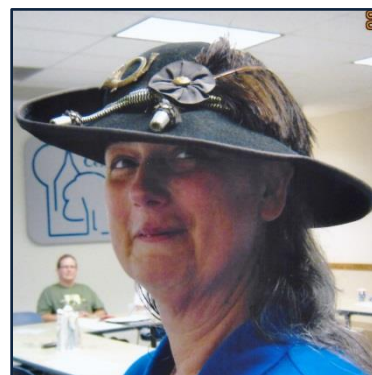

Ken Wargo, Chairman of the Delavan Civil War Monument Restoration Task Force, accepts a check for \$1000 from Treasurer Sandy Stratmeyer. The funds were raised primarily at our rummage sale and cemetery walk in July. Ken reported that as of the week before our meeting, the restoration fund was at \$18,000. With our Tent's donation, along with several other recent donations, they are nearly at their goal of \$20,000 and will be able to begin the restoration of the monument soon.

REENACTOR AT GETTYSBURG 150<sup>TH</sup>

Sister Susan Fallon and her husband Patrick attended the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Gettysburg as reenactors in Cushing's Battery, an artillery unit that does its training in Boscobel, WI. They camped in canvas tents in a freshly mowed field in 95 degree weather. It was ¼ mile to the nearest porta-potty and ½ mile to the shuttle that would take you to the sutler's tents to purchase anything you were unable to make yourself. She also portrays Ellen Wilson, a vivandiere (Federal field nurse), and showed us the museum-quality uniforms she had made herself from material woven on a 160-year-old loom. The skirt had blue and black stripes along the bottom which indicated she was with the infantry; black also designated medical or minister. Medical supplies a nurse would carry included two canteens, one for water and one for spirits, and bandages.



## LAKE GENEVA YACHT CLUB GAR TROPHY

Bob Pagel, Chairman of the Trophy Committee for the Lake Geneva Yacht Club, brought the Whitewing Trophy to our August meeting. He explained that the travelling trophy, a silver coffee server, was first presented to the winner of a sailing competition on Lake Geneva in 1883 by the Lake Geneva GAR Post 27. After an indefinite time at the bottom of the lake, it was recovered in 1974 by divers and restored by the LGYC. It is the 2<sup>nd</sup> oldest trophy of over 175 trophies the LGYC awards each year. Only the Sheridan trophy is older, named after the Civil War general who would vacation in Lake Geneva.

### 2013 NATIONAL CONVENTION

The DUVCW National Convention was held in Lincoln, Nebraska from July 31 – August 4. Pat Blackmer and Pam Johnson were again honored to serve as color bearers (top right). Pat has been elected to serve on the Council next year and was sworn in with the other new officers (second from top). In addition to the business meetings, there was a Grand Opening the first evening, workshops and presentations including one on Women in the Civil War, a Memory Banquet, a Granddaughters Breakfast, and an All States Banquet (third from top). During the All States Banquet, Jo Seiler presented “Hidden in Plain View: A Secret Story of Quilts and the Underground Railroad”. Various states competed for a travelling trophy for best skit. Michigan won with a hilarious skit featuring residents of a retirement home. PNP Ozzie Thompson, who attended our Induction/Installation Ceremony, conducted a fundraising auction. One afternoon featured a lunch at and a tour of the Governor’s Mansion (bottom right) and Nebraska State Capitol, followed by a wreath laying ceremony at the GAR Circle in Wyuka Cemetery (bottom left), where 110 Union veterans are buried. Next year the National Convention will be held July 30 – August 3 in Gettysburg, PN.



Omaha had been the capital of the Nebraska Territory since its creation in 1854. Many of the people south of the Platte River had been sympathetic to the Confederate cause in the Civil War. When it was suggested that the capital be moved to Lancaster, Omaha attempted to derail the move by trying to have the city renamed after President Lincoln, and assumed that the legislature would not pass the measure if the future capital were named after the former President. To Omaha’s disappointment, the measure passed; Lancaster was renamed Lincoln and became the state capital when Nebraska was admitted to the Union in 1867. The capitol building is the 2<sup>nd</sup> tallest U.S. State Capitol. The Gettysburg Address is carved into the granite backdrop of the *Standing Lincoln* statue which was designed in 1912 by sculptor Daniel Chester French. French collaborated with architect Henry Bacon to provide the statue's setting, and ten years later the duo also designed the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C., which uses the same head as the one on *Standing Lincoln*.
